### Overview

Trauma is an important and evolving field. There are numerous and frequent developments in the treatment of critically injured patients from resuscitation, ICU care, through discharge to rehabilitation. It is a field which requires the involvement of several subspecialties, all of whom bring different experience and knowledge to the patient's bedside. This conference will provide multidisciplinary collaboration in order to improve the care of patients and improve communication to enhance existing treatment. There is also a need to educate residents from other subspecialties, such as the Burn Center, on the care of critically injured patients. There will be a strong emphasis on the transfer of topics from the performance improvement committee to the Trauma Lecture Series in order to enhance education and fill knowledge gaps. There will also be outside speakers to bring new thought and expertise to the University of Kansas Hospital.

### Who will receive an eeds card?

### How do I get an eeds card?

One card will be issued for attendance at all KUMC accredited regularly scheduled conferences and grand rounds.
